<p><b>Pack 157 Policies</b>          Pack 157 <u>requires</u> that older Cubs have a parent present at <u>all activities</u>, unless (1) explicit prior agreement has been made with the activity leader, (2) there is another adult who has agreed to be responsible for the Scout and (3) the parent has signed and submitted a BSA Activity Consent Form.</p> <p>Boys are welcome to attend Cub Scout meetings and events before deciding to join. Potential Scouts must have a parent/guardian in attendance. They are welcome to attend the daytime portion of the Scout House overnight but cannot spend the night until they are registered Scouts.</p>	<p>Initials Required</p> <p>_____</p>
